Earth Hour is the world's largest movement for the environment. Its purpose is to raise awareness and support action to reverse climate change and nature loss. Earth Hour started right here in Australia in 2007, when people across the country switched their lights off to symbolise their support for stronger action against climate change, and a healthy future for people and nature. Now, millions of people in over 7,000 cities across 190+ countries take part each year!

WHY SHOULD YOUR SCHOOL WEAR IT WILD

Australia is home to an incredible array of animals and plants found nowhere else. Sadly, we have one of the highest extinction rates in the world. Wildlife populations are in decline across the country, and over 1,900 species are threatened with extinction due to the introduction of invasive species, habitat

Preventing extinction is not enough to protect the future of Australia's precious wildlife and iconic landscapes; we must reverse it. WWF-Australia aims to Regenerate Nature by 2030 by working to actively reverse species decline across the country. By your school taking action this Earth Hour Schools Day on Friday 21 March (or any date in March), you'll be

supporting this mission and contributing to a healthy future for people and nature in Australia and around the world.

HOW TO GET INVOLVED







WHAT YOU NEED TO DO

Get started by signing up and creating a fundraising page for your school - it's quick, easy, secure and the money comes directly to WWF-Australia. You can share your fundraising page with students and their families to raise even more money!

- 2. Personalise your fundraising page with your schools information. Add why you care about nature and your fundraising target. We recommend setting the target at \$2 per student at your school. e.g. if your school has 250 students you would set your goal at \$500.
- 3. Spread the word to pupils and their parents, letting them know your *Wear it Wild* date and what they need to do to take part. Share your link to your online fundraising page with your school community to get donations rolling in.
- 4. Download ROARsome resources, lesson plans and activites to help you go wild.
- 5. Share photos and videos of your school Wearing it Wild using the hashtag #WearItWild #EarthHour2024 and tag @WWF_Australia

WHAT YOUR STUDENTS NEED TO DO

- Make a small donation at school or on your fundraising page at earthhour.org.au to dress in their wildlife-inspired clothing. We suggest \$2 per student.
- Get creative and wear an item of wildlife inspired clothing on your Wear it Wild date!
